Coastal trails

- Wild camping is prohibited in Corsica. We recommend checking the opening hours and capacity of Bonifacio's campsites when planning your stay.
- Parking of motorhomes is strictly prohibited, both day and night:
 - On the shores and beaches of the island
 - In classified woods, forests, and parks
 - On roads and public thoroughfares
- Parking on public roads, governed by the highway code, specifies that motorhomes may park in authorized vehicle spaces, provided they are unoccupied and during the day, and that parking does not exceed 7 consecutive days.
- Dogs are tolerated as long as they are kept on a leash on all the beaches of the Bonifacio Mouths Nature Reserve.

Unmissable sites of the Medieval City

This route can be followed with or without an audio guide

- 1

L'OFFICE DE TOURISME
It is located at No. 2, Scamaroni street, an important thoroughfare, formerly called Rue Nationale and U Stradun by the Bonifacians. Since 1944, this street owes its current name to Fred Scamaroni, a national hero of the Resistance whose family was originally from Bonifacio.
- 2

LA RUE LONGUE
Already mentioned in the 13th century under the name Platea Lunga, it is more than 90 meters long and was once one of the most commercial streets in the city. In 1851, this street was one of the most populated (341 inhabitants) in the Old Town, along with Rue Doria (420 inhabitants).
- 3

LA RUE DES 2 EMPEREURS
Two plaques commemorate the visits of Charles V and Bonaparte. Starting from this old street, numerous alleys with arches form aqueducts to collect rainwater.
- 4

LA PLACE D'ARMES
Former military square of the city at the time of the Republic of Genoa, it was transformed into a fish market. The circular tops of three grain silos can still be seen today.
- 5

LA PORTE DE GÈNES
Formerly called U Punti d'Ad'atu, U Purtun or la Grande Porte, the Delille-type drawbridge that we see today dates from 1830 (French period) and replaced the old swing drawbridge dating from 1598 (Genoese period).
- 6

LE JARDIN DES VESTIGES
Ruins of 13th century fortifications, discovered during excavations. It is an integral part of the visit to the Bastion of the Standard.
- 7

U MASGILU
Formerly called U Masgili, a word meaning «butchery» and not «market» (mercatu). However, the two terms have become confused over time, especially since the site, after having been used as a slaughterhouse, was later developed into a covered market. Breathtaking view of the Bouches de Bonifacio and Campu Rumanilu.
- 8

LA PLACE DE LA MANICHELLA
Piazza with a breathtaking view of Sardinia, there are two very deep grain silos (under a Plexiglas pyramid) dug into the rock and located under the paving.
- 9

L'ÉGLISE SAINTE-MARIE-MAJEURE
Main church and oldest building in Bonifacio. Built in the 12th century by the Pisans, the entrance is preceded by a loggia, the place where the «elders» used to meet to deliberate on the city's decisions.
- 10

LA MAISON DES PODESTATS
Situatued at 28 rue Doria and with a very old pediment (around 1320), this house belonged to the Doria family of Genoese nobility, whose several generations of Podestats succeeded one another to represent the Serenissima Republic of Genoa in Bonifacio.
- 11

LA MAISON DORIA
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- 12

L'ÉGLISE SAINT-JEAN-BAPTISTE
Built in 1785, also known as the Chapel of Mercy and where the processional group representing «the beheading of St. John the Baptist» can be found.
- 13

L'ESCALIER DU ROY D'ARAGON
Legend has it that the 187 steps carved sheer into the cliff were dug out in one night by the soldiers of the King of Aragon, Alfonso V, during the siege of 1420. In reality, the construction of this staircase is linked to the Torrione (see below): in the event of an attack, help could reach the town by sea. *Visiting this very special site requires a good level of physical fitness and respect for safety rules. To descend the stairs, wearing closed shoes is mandatory..*
- 14

LE TORRIONE
Built from 1480 onwards, the Torrione has undergone several consolidations and been used for many purposes, including as a gunpowder magazine. Destroyed in 1901 because it was too visible a landmark for enemy armies, it was rebuilt in the 1980s
- 15

L'ÉGLISE SAINT-DOMINIQUE
One of the rare religious buildings in Corsica to present elements of Gothic architecture. Classified as Historical Monument, the numerous paintings exhibited as well as two of the four shrines (processional groups of Saint-Barthélemy and Sainte-Marie-Madeleine) are visible by the public free of charge.
- 16

LES CASERNES MONTLAUR
Testimony of the military life that animated and cemented the daily life of the city until the 1980s. Two main barracks: the «Genoese» to the south and the «French» to the north.
- 17

LA PLACE DE L'EUROPE
Here stands a monument brought back by the foreign legion in 1963 to commemorate the battle of Saida. Also known as Bir Hakeim Square, it is an obligatory crossroads for those who want to go to the town hall, the post office or to enter the Old Town.

- A

L'ÉGLISE SAINT-ÉRASME
Built from the 13th century, it is dedicated to the patron saint and protector of fishermen.
- B

LA CHAPELLE SAINT-ROCHL
Raised where the last victim of the plague epidemic of 1528 died, which reduced the local population by three-quarters.
- C

LE BASTION DE L'ÉTENDARD
Fortifications known as «Genoese», designed in the 16th century after the Franco-Turkish siege and adapted to the new weapons and siege techniques of this period: it offers an exceptional panorama of the port and the cliffs. Inside you will find an exhibition retracing 1000 years of history.
- D

LE MONUMENT AUX MORTS
Monolithic block brought back from the island of San-Bainzo, next to the island of Cavallo, where an ancient Roman granite quarry once operated.
- E

L'ÉGLISE SAINTE-CROIX
Former hospice «Domus Misericordae» founded thanks to public charity in the 13th century. Today it is the seat of the eponymous brotherhood which preciously keeps a piece of the true cross of Christ with which the priest blesses the crowd on the evening of Good Friday.
- F

L'ESPACE SAINT-JACQUES
An old 12th chapel transformed into a site for cultural events and exhibitions.
- G

LA HALLE DE L'ARSENAL
Built in 1492, perhaps on the site of the former Saint-Laurent chapel built by the Templar Knights, it is the site of the weekly market today (Tuesdays and Fridays).
- H

LA COUR CARRÉE
On the side of the church of Saint-Dominique, the Cour Carrée was the interior garden of the former Dominican convent. It is now used as a venue for open-air events (concerts, theatre and cinema, etc.).
- I

LE CIMETIÈRE MARIN
Located on the edge of the peninsula, it overlooks the Bouches de Bonifacio. It is known as the most beautiful cemetery in the Mediterranean. Correct dress requested.
- J

LE GOUVERNAIL
Built in 1880, this military site is a long tunnel with 168 steps that descend to a platform called «the rudder of Corsica». Equipped with a powerful searchlight, its purpose was to illuminate the strait as far as the coast of Sardinia and to help the artillerymen (situated above, near the cemetery) to locate their targets at night. Paid site can be visited from may to october. Tel. : +33 (0)6 19 73 69 75
- K

LE CHEMIN DE RONDE
An integral part of the ramparts of the Citadel, the site is remarkable and is listed as a Historic Monument.
